The Green Space Initiative was formed to coordinate the restoration, maintenance and expansion of the commercial, residential and public green spaces in our community. Funded through events and contributions to the Chestnut Hill Community Fund, it presently consists of a consortium of residents, business people and representatives from community organizations including the Chestnut Hill Community Association, the Chestnut Hill Business Association, the Business Improvement District, the Garden District Fund, Morris Arboretum, Pennsylvania Horticultural Society and Chestnut Hill College.

Street Trees Have Great Benefits, Environmental and Financial

The Green Space Initiative is continuing the work begun 50 years ago. In the 1960s the Chestnut Hill Community Association planted 50 ginkgo trees along Germantown Avenue. They have grown tall and beautiful, and many still line the Avenue turning a glorious golden hue in autumn.

Street trees provide a canopy and setting for a connection to nature and the human senses. They create a more pleasant walking environment, absorb pollutant gases, provide oxygen and cool a hot summer pavement by up to 10 degrees. In addition, businesses on treescaped streets show a 12 percent higher income stream, and realtor-based estimates show street trees increase home or

business values by as much as \$25,000.

The Green Space Initiative has surveyed Germantown Avenue from Bethlehem Pike to Cresheim Valley Drive and has identified 50 locations that would benefit from planting a new tree.
