- 1. President's Welcome (Approval of September special meeting minutes & email vote)
- a. Annual Appeal Kathi thanked the Board members who responded to her request for testimonial from the Board regarding why they think it is important to give to the CHCA. This will be used in the annual appeal campaign. It was agreed to create group to strategize appeal and membership promotion.
- b. Governance Committee vote needed on co-chairs and additional member

A motion was made to elect Laura Lucas and Beth Wright as Co-Chairs of the governance Committee, seconded. Motion

Additional Member - Dan Pulka. New addition to Governance Committee. Previously VP of Operations. Great advocate of CHCA. Depth of understanding of bylaws. Real desire to be reengaged. Runs one of the biggest law firms in the city.

Vote: Unanimous - YES (22). Opposed. None.

- 2. Physical Division Joyce Lenhardt (standing in for Larry)
- a. 301 Rex Ave Zoned RSA-3 Requesting a variance for an accessory structure of 267 SF; limit of accessory structure is 130 SF. Committee supported it unanimously, under the condition that intention to use it for family use, and not for rent or temporary lodging is memorialized. Cool non-conforming structure. Jody Greenblatt (property owner) joined the meeting to answer questions.

Richard Bartholomew –Reporting for HDAC – Provision requested further exploration of the fenestration which was not in keeping with the original structure. What is the plan? Owners still figuring out next steps. Approval requires that change in plans for the windows on the staircase be brought back to the DRC for consideration. Motion to remove "On the staircase." Much discussion. Final motion: Recommendation is to support the variance request as presented with two project provisos:

- 1. That the structure not be used for temporary lodging
- 2. That any change in plans for the windows be brought back to the DRC for approval

Kathi Clayton – Motion to vote. David Caulk (2nd to vote).

b. CHDPG (Chestnut Hill Development Planning Group) update - Anne

At the October 21 meeting there was discussion of purpose and membership of ad hoc committee or think tank. Purpose: Purpose – CHDPG is a think tank to consider planning challenges and opportunities in the community

Membership – Each of the member organizations (Conservancy, CHBD, CHCA, FOW)

can send 5 representatives, excluding executive directors and presidents, and

excepting FOW, which can send 1 representative, be it the executive director or

whomever they choose to send. Also, the facilitator is excepted.

Celeste Hardester is the group's facilitator

Philadelphia 2035 – No one at PCPC (Philadelphia Planning Commission) able to confirm time line.

3. Financial Report - David Caulk

New budget and finance committee. Monthly cadence and meetings. Now sharing monthly financials. Thank you to Cathy Brzozowski and Beth Wright for engaging. Line item: \$15,000 of grants approved by board – Friends of Jenks, Friends of Library, and Water Tower. All greatly appreciated.

Working to develop a budget, with comparison to previous years.

Celebrating success of Fall Frolic. Advantage of Cricket Club as venue – if a member sets up an event, you are not charged a fee. Special thanks to the Chestnut Hill Hospital and Merrill Lynch for their sponsorship and huge support.

Had meeting with John Durr re: Chestnut Hill Local to get better sense of their finances. Is it possible for further partnership with Local on membership drives. CH Local – Proposing a 5 million dollar capital campaign.

4. CH Community Fund

a. Investment Presentation - Jason

Community Fund Portfolio – Last cadence was five years ago. Moving forward, will now be presented on a quarterly basis. (\$819,000). 80% in Equity. Goal to have fund last in perpetuity. Aggressive investing. Report on different holdings. Fund is down 19.87% in 2022.

2014. 2019. No action by the fund. Great for the investment. Non-compliant, as a non-profit foundation: income had not been spent every year to the level the IRS requires.

2021 - \$15,000 given by the CH Fund via the CHCA community association.

Account started in 2001 with 20,000 or 30,000. In 2007 – CHCA sold a second property. \$621,000 in income. Also a bequest of \$200,000.

No immediate change in investments planned. Losses in line with markets.

Finance committee actively looking at possible changes to portfolio based on market cycles. Looking at areas of economy which are providing good/better dividends.

CHCA Assets

15/20 year approach. No equities. Primarily cash. Bonds – set aside as the Tree Fund. \$125,000 in money markets. \$83,000 in bonds. Still conservative, but generating income. Should be the goal to grow the assets.

Laura Lucas – IRS Guidelines re: a supporting organization are being followed – However, board level discussion and strategic planning over the Chestnut Hill Community Fund still necessary. 75-year anniversary for Town Hall coming up.

b. Update on status – Ted Edwards – Attorney with Troutman and Pepper.

Fund. 1.34 million (down from 1.43 million.) – Cash (207,000), investments (935,000), fixed (real estate - 8434 Germantown Avenue property) \$9,100 per month. Investments down. Audit cycle beginning in the coming months. Will included real estate maintenance update.

Andrew Glendening – Volunteer contractor and trustee of the fund currently facilities manager. Building well taken care off.

5. Proposal for Community Partner Updates - Kathi

Proposal that institutional partners should submit a written update to the board, to inform about events or happenings at the partnering organizations, if there is something taking place.

Now six institutional partners. Each meeting, one partner would give a ten-minute presentation (in depth) on the ongoings at their institution. Things that are not heard, but are important.

Anne McNiff – CHCA meeting with CH Local weekly to explore and implement membership initiatives.
